

Grade 11s,

You will be registering for **Grade 12** during the week after spring break. We will be coming to one of your classes. Both the registration form and the Course Handbook are linked to this post.

You can use the registration form to plan which courses you are interested in taking next year. There is a different form if you are a French Immersion student.

To graduate with a High School Diploma, the requirements include:

100 credits

Grade 12 level of both English and Social Studies

Grade 11 level of Math and Science

PhysEd 10

CALM

10 option credits (CTS/Fine Arts/Second Languages)

10 30-level credits (not English or Social Studies)

You will need to complete all of these requirements to graduate

For French Immersion students, to earn a Bilingual Certificate, the requirements are:

40 credits in French Immersion courses

FLA 10, FLA 20, FLA 30

another French Immersion course at the 30-level

To graduate with a Certificate of High School Achievement (K&E certificate), the requirements include:

80 credits

English 20-2 or 30-4, Social 10-2 or 20-4, Math 10-3 or 20-4, Science 14 or 20-4

PhysEd 10

CALM

5 30-level CTS credits AND 5 30-level WorkEx Credits; OR 5 30-level RAP credits

You will need to complete all of these requirements to graduate.

Completing the Registration Form

Remember: for a 3-credit class, divide the block into two parts.

There are three sections in the registration form:

Section 1:

This is where you select your core courses. If you have not already taken PhysEd 10 and CALM, you will need to register for these courses.

Section 2:

This is where you select your electives. Only select enough classes to fill in your timetable.

If you passed the 20-level course of Math, Science, Social and English AND have earned at least 75 credits, you are permitted to take up to two spares in Grade 12.

Section 3:

These are classes that occur outside the regular class time. These would be extra classes to your completed timetable.

Alternative Electives

These courses are your second choices, in case you are unable to get into an elective chosen in Section 2.
