

Grade 9s,

You will be registering for **Grade 10** during the week after spring break. We will be coming to one of your classes. Both the registration form and the Course Handbook are linked to this post.

You can use the registration form to decide which courses you are interested in taking next year.

In high school, there are 8 blocks (4 in each semester). The four core classes (English, Science, Social, Math) will take up 4 of those blocks.

*In this sample timetable, the student is taking 5 credit PhysEd, so it runs the full semester. Leadership 10, Textile Arts 10, CALM and Foods 10 are 3 credit courses, so they only run for half the semester.

When you are picking options, make sure you are only picking enough to fill the spaces in your timetable. Grade 10s are typically not permitted to have spares.

PhysEd 10 (either 3 credit or 5 credit) is a graduation requirement. CALM is also a graduation requirement.

If you are planning to take one or both of these courses in summer school, you do not need to register in these courses for Grade 10.

If you are NOT planning to take these courses in summer school, you need to register for these courses as part of your Grade 10 registration.

Completing the Registration Form

Fill in the following template as you choose courses.

Remember: for a 3-credit class, divide the block into two parts.

There are three sections in the registration form:

Section 1:

This is where you select your four core courses, PhysEd 10 and CALM. The recommendations for core courses are based on your current mark in your Grade 9 core classes.

If you are currently taking K&E classes, it does not mean you need to register for K&E in Grade 10. If you are unsure, talk to your current teacher.

Section 2:

This is where you select your electives. Only select enough classes to completely fill in your timetable.

Section 3:

These are classes that occur outside the regular class time and are for credits. These would be extra classes to your completed timetable.

Alternative Electives

These courses are your second choices, in case you are unable to get into an elective chosen in Section 2. Make sure you pick three of these.
